

BOARD-SUPERINTENDENT RELATIONSHIP

The Board of Education believes that the development and adoption of policies is the most important function of a School Board, and the execution of the policies is the function of the Superintendent of Schools.

Delegation by the Board of Education of its executive powers to the Superintendent of Schools provides freedom for him/her to manage the school within the Board of Education's policies and frees the Board of Education to devote its time to policymaking and appraisal functions.

The Board of Education holds the Superintendent of Schools responsible for the administration of its policies, the execution of Board of Education's decisions, the operation of the internal machinery designed to serve the educational programs and for keeping the Board of Education informed about District operations and problems.

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
