Graduation Requirements for the Class of 2019

For a **New York State Regents Diploma:** all students are required to complete a minimum of 22 credits including the following: English 4 credits; Social Studies 4 credits; Mathematics 3 credits; Science 3 credits; Language Other Than English 1 credit; Health ½ credit; Art/Music 1 credit; Physical Education 2 credits; Electives 3 ½ credits, plus a grade of 65 or better in 5 state exams.

For a **New York State Advanced Regents Diploma:** in addition to the diploma requirements above, students must earn either 5 credits in art, music or occupational education, or earn 3 credits in a LOTE. Scores of 65 or higher must also be earned on 8 or 9 State Exams.
